Having said that, we are open to offers for other entertainments to draw the village together and contribute to the spirit of community and would appreciate having some ideas. In light of that, Mike and Clare Ashton are organising a function, to coincide with the Royal Wedding, and details of this are published on page 16. There are also mutterings about a jubilee year celebration for 2012. I and the committee will be looking into that, in forthcoming meetings.

Some of you will have noted that we don't normally have a newsletter at this time, however, your Chairman and Secretary, having got their heads together, felt that it was perfectly feasible and would give more continuity to have a newsletter, every 4 months or so, rather than just twice a year, bearing in mind the spacing of our functions. In that vein we are still looking for contributions, your comments, letters and thoughts are more than welcome and hopefully Mavis will find enough material to keep us occupied with the history of the village, in all 3 yearly editions.

Planning matters

I have checked with the Council regarding the situation of The Old Rectory. As you will be aware, planning permission has been granted for a number of apartments within the main building, however the Council is still awaiting an enabling planning request, which will involve the construction of one or more buildings within its curtilage. Once approved, to help fund the overall development, work will go ahead, but the Council is at this point in time, waiting for the developers.

With regard to the Reading Room, there are still one or two anomalies here, which need to be resolved, but we have had offers to cosmetically enhance the Reading Room and there are alternative suggestions within the Council that subject to a guarantee of repair and restoration for either offices or additional dwelling space, the property could be let at a peppercorn rent.

Village Green

We have had instances of notes placed on villagers' cars parked in front of the reading room, presumably under the impression that they were a result of the influx of student parking, which has become a problem in some areas and will be covered later.

An anonymous note was also placed on the notice board, with particular reference to the churning up of the green, when the weather is bad, the ground is soft and it is used by those hiring out the hall, as additional car parking. Whilst sympathising with the sentiment behind the comments regarding parking on the green, I would think that anyone wishing to make

an effective point, would be better served contacting the CVRA or The Village Hall committee, in person. That said, I have looked into the situation. Neither the CVRA nor the Village Hall can do much more than ask the hirers of the hall and their respective parties not to park on the grass when wet. Neither have any authority or permission to manage or control the green. It belongs to and is the responsibility of the City Council. On behalf of the Village and the CVRA I shall be talking to the council to encourage them to repair and come up with a solution.

We are always happy to receive genuine concerns, raised in way which opens the door to constructive consideration. Having said that we are going to ask that hirers are requested to take more care when parking in wet weather and propose that appropriate notices are placed inside and outside the hall, accordingly.

Whilst on the subject, I must once again remind everyone that the notice board is for village issues arising through or with the consent of the CVRA or the wardens of St. Mary's church. Please, if you have anything for the notice board, contact me or Graeme Barker, who will see that is included or if it is contentious, seek a decision from CVRA. It is intended to enhance the notice board in due course and a more secure locking mechanism will be fitted.

Following on from the previous comments; there are genuine concerns regarding the level of student parking. The committee shall be taking this up with the campus managers, and shall be asking, committee member Dr Roy Smith to present our concerns to the appropriate people.

We have had great support from non-members but we would like to ask those

of you, who feel that you could offer some support, however limited, maybe just one afternoon a year or a couple of days, or a few evenings, or more, to get in touch, either with a view to joining the committee or just offering your services to be part of any team, created to run the functions. This needn't be onerous and can be very rewarding.

Rebecca Massarella (16) of Leabrook Close, is currently studying at The Nottingham Emmanuel School. She is planning to go out to Ghana at the start of July 2011 to take part in "Project Ghana", which will enable her to make a genuine contribution to the sustainable development of education in Africa.

Rebecca will be participating in a community project through The Sabre Charitable Trust, which will

involve the renovation of a classroom and the building of a playground at a school in a Ghanaian Village. The trip will last a total of ten days, and as part of the journey she will be trekking through the rain forests of the Kakum National Park. As part of the visit the group will learn about the impact of the

slave trade in Africa and visit one of the historic forts along the picturesque coast overlooking the Gulf of Guinea.

The expedition is being organised by World Challenge, with 14 of us taking part in the expedition, Rebecca, two teachers, six post 16 students and 5 other year 11 students.

Rebecca needs to raise £1700.00 in order for World Challenge to accept her on this trip of a life time, and she has been undertaking many fundraising activities to help her achieve this figure. What Visitors Come to See in St. Marys Church, Clifton

Alabaster, the softer marble, was mined locally, and in medieval times was a European business. Many local churches have examples of the craft, and St Mary's in Clifton is amongst those that have a share of these treasures. We have pearl white, an effigy of Lady Alice, wife of a Sir Gervase. Her hands and headdress are so beautiful. On the floor nearby is the brass of her husband c. 1491. This man benefitted from being a knight, loyal to Richard III, and was given for his services, lands of the Dukes of Buckingham and Exeter at the Coronation. The knight in stylish repose, is Sir John, the only one so named, who died at the battle of Shrewsbury, fighting with Henry IV in the Scots and Welsh rebellion wars of 1403.

The Main alter tomb is Sir Gervase, known as the Gentle and his two wives. He is depicted in full tudor dress, 1564, and his ladies are identical with ruffs, jewellery and clothes. They are Mary Neville and Winifred Thwaites. He was a courtier during the reigns of Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary and Elizabeth I. He was also Constable of Doncaster Castle at the Rising of the North when the Catholics marched for relaxation of the Protestant Church Liturgy. He was the Queens Champion on state occasions. He died in 1587 leaving a four month old grandson as his heir, as his only son George had died before the birth, aged 29. He was looked after by his maternal grandmother, Lady Anne Thorold, and there is a black and white marble slab, telling of her virtues. The brass of the Elizabethan young people are his parents. This baby was Sir Gervase 1st Baronet who had seven wives. He lived until the age of 80, dying in 1666 after living through the reigns of Elizabeth I, James I, Charles I, the Civil War and Charles II.

The monument in the transept to his three wives is unique with time, body interpretations and marital crests. The coffin is Jacobean in shape. There is another plaque and bust in the chancel to him and all of his wives. The bust is similar to the style of Bellini's Charles I. Family plaques to the last family of true Cliftons and the bright memorial windows to Sir Jukes 8th Baronet are large features. Lady Marianne, his daughter, married Sir Henry Bruce and began the present lineage of the family, but that is another story.
